These are given by a wide variety of outstanding musicians, including young local talented performers, schoolchildren, young musicians from prestigious conservatories and schools of music who are on the way to glittering musical careers and international recitalists who are visiting the United Kingdom.

Admission to these recitals is *always free* and, although there is the opportunity to make a donation to the Organ Appeal, the principal objective is to raise awareness of our project and spread the word more widely.

So please support us not only by attending but by **bringing with you your friends, colleagues and visitors to Coventry**. The duration of each recital is around 30 to 40 minutes and there are free refreshments afterwards when you and your guests can meet the performers.



May 4th well-known local soprano **Wendy Whyte** (pictured left) and pianist Antoine Mitchell present a glorious programme of French song. **May 18th** we welcome Leicestershire-based opera stars **Nicola Bingham, Debbie Dubberley and Ethne Goode**, who are performing Opera favourites including, for example, 'Che farò' from Gluck's 'Orfeo' and 'Softly awakes my heart' from Saint-Saens' 'Samson & Delilah'. **May 25th** we host the **Dutch choir 'Vocal Devotion'** on tour in the UK, who will sing a programme of favourite sacred songs and hymns. All these recitals commence at 1.00 pm – a perfect add-on to lunch in town or a shopping trip!
