Long-range weather forecaster, outspoken critic of false religion, endurance runner – the biblical prophet Elijah was a man of action. But when a powerful enemy threatens his life, the miracle-working prophet becomes a shadow of his former self. In the wilderness, he asks God to let him die, overwhelmed with a sense that he's done nothing worthwhile with his life. Only when God feeds him, and speaks encouraging words to him, does his journey towards restoration of body and spirit begin.

Does mental ill-health lie beneath the surface of Elijah's story? The writers of the Bible didn't see the workings of the mind in the way we do: the story of Elijah isn't a psychology textbook case study. But if Elijah's frantic bouts of activity, and collapse into despair, make him sound to us rather bipolar (or what used to be called manic-depressive), he's a lot like us: one in twenty people in the UK (church congregations included) is on the bipolar spectrum. But our creator God cared for Elijah, and cares about us – body, mind and spirit.

As the body of Christ here at Holy Trinity, we're aiming to become more aware of those among us and around us in the city centre suffering poor mental health. And to offer better care where we can.
