#### Mission focus, January 2025

John and Rachel are our CMS Mission Partners working on Bible translation and discipleship in the Middle East since the 1980s, currently serving in an unstable, war-afflicted area. Rachel was a member of Holy Trinity before going overseas. John is part of an international team involved in the NT translation for one language group, and an OT translation for another! The current instability in the Middle East has resulted in local people becoming more fearful to act as local translators or community checkers. John and Rachel have two grown-up children, one in UK and one serving in the Far East. We pray regularly for them, and they do visit us when they are back in UK, every couple of years.

#### A NEW TRIENNIUM... AND A GOODBYE

On Saturday 16 November, members of Diocesan Synod met for the first meeting of the new triennium (a fancy word for a three-year term).

The meeting also marked Bishop's Ruth last Diocesan Synod with us as Acting Bishop of Coventry, after a year in the

#### 2025 BUDGET

Synod reviewed the proposed 2025 budget for the Coventry Diocesan Board of Finance (CDBF). The budget is reviewed by the Diocesan Finance Group and Investment Sub-Committee before being scrutinised by Bishop's Council who are the Directors and Trustees of the DBF.

16 NOVEMBER 2024

Following the recommendation by Bishop's Council, Diocesan Synod approved the 2025 CDBF budget, authorising a maximum expenditure for the upcoming year of £14.232 million.

## OUR SHARED FUTURE

Archdeacon Missioner Barry Dugmore and Diocesan Secretary Jacqueline Ladds shared an overview of the vision and strategy for the whole diocese -Our Shared Future.

They summarised some of the challenges facing our parishes, schools, chaplaincies and Cathedral, and outlined the steps that will be taken to prepare ourselves for the arrival of Bishop Sophie in Spring 2025. More info in this presentation.
