New Sermon Series (Four Sundays: 9 February to 2 March)

The Book of Ruth (p.267-270 in the church Bible)

How shall we live? How shall we love? For Christians, they are the same question. To live is to love. To love is to live.

The Book of Ruth, the central character, is a story of family loyalty and loyalty to God and his ways. It's part of the story within the Book of Judges, that terrible time in Israel's history when Israel had no king, and everyone did as they saw fit. But Ruth, who was not an Israelite, came to believe in God and through her marriage to an Israelite called Boaz, became the great-grandmother of King David, and ancestor of Jesus.

Ruth's story is of ordinary people working out how to live in God's loving ways through challenging personal circumstances. The story reveals how our God of love works through faithful people to fulfil his purpose for them, for their community, nation and even for all humanity.

The four chapters cover:

Loving in terrible times

Loving at work

Loving through risk

Loving beyond imagination

Much to enjoy and much to learn from, of our own lives, loves, relationships, work colleagues and community.

Mission focus, February 2025 - Coventry Street Pastors



Coventry Street Pastors are volunteers from many local churches, who work with people enjoying the city centre club nightlife, from 10pm to 3am on Fridays and Saturdays. The pastors are welcomed and endorsed by the police, city council and business community.

They are known as 'flip-flop pastors' providing simple footwear to those who can't manage to walk in their fancy shoes, or 'lollipop pastors' when they offer tokens of love and relief to distressed youngsters at the end of a night out. They bring a Christian presence, a listening ear, warm safe spaces, drinks and all manner of tender loving care. Where appropriate they share about Jesus and pray with people.

Emmanuel Vasanthakumar, a member of HTC and often to be seen around the AV desk at the back of church, is a member of the team; they are looking for more volunteers to become street pastors, so if interested, please speak to him.

"Real faith in a real life" – Learning from King David
