

New Electoral Roll

A new Church Electoral Roll is being prepared. This happens in every Church of England parish, every six years. Every person who wishes to have their name entered on the new Roll, whether it is entered on the present Roll or not, is requested to apply for enrolment not later than Sunday 27th April 2025.

Under the Church Representation Rules, you can be on the Electoral Roll if you are:

- (a) baptised
- (b) aged 16 or over, and
- (c) have habitually attended Holy Trinity for at least six months or you live in the parish

Why go on the Electoral Roll?

It is a way of declaring that you are a member of Holy Trinity and entitles you to vote in any elections at the Parochial Church Council Annual General Meeting. Anyone wishing to be a member of the PCC will need to have been on the Electoral Roll for six months.

How can I make sure I am included on the new Electoral Roll? There are new paper copies available at the back of church.

There's also an online form, which you can access via https://forms.office.com/e/yXvParNsvD

Or you can scan in the QR code on your phone/tablet.





Annual Meetings

Each Parish Church is required to hold an Annual Meeting of Parishioners at which the Church Wardens are elected, and an Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) at which the Parochial Church Council (PCC) presents reports to the Church on any changes to the Electoral Roll; the finances of the Church; the Building and Fabric; and on the activities of the Diocese and Deanery that the Parish Church belongs to. New PCC members are also elected for a 3-year term at the APCM.

This year's Annual Meetings are on Sunday, 18 May at 11am. There are vacancies for 4 Wardens and 4 PCC members. If you are interested in standing for election there are nomination forms available on the Church website or by the PCC noticeboard. There is also a description of the responsibliites and a list of meeting dates available. *Keri Husband, PCC Secretary*

Mission focus, April 2025 – Coventry Foodbank



Coventry has 15 foodbanks distributed around the city, mostly run by churches. They are part of a network of >400 foodbanks in the UK linked to the Trussell Trust, which provides more than 2 million 3-day emergency food parcels per year to hungry families. We can help by: volunteering, giving food or giving money (see: https://coventry.foodbank.org.uk/give-help/).

HTC gave £1350 in 2024, and we regularly donate food (tins, packets) via the collection box at the back of church, which is taken to a local foodbank by Jan Clarke. **Please note there is a still a great need for these regular donations of food.**



Is Peace Possible in Israel and Palestine? - A Lecture with Daniel Munayer 7pm, Wednesday 2nd April, Coventry Cathedral



Is a lasting and just peace possible in Israel and Palestine? Occupation, war, extremism, terrorism and fear are all words we hear used to describe what is happening in Israel and Palestine. Daniel Munayer, director of Musalaha, a reconciliation ministry in Israel and Palestine, and the only Palestinian ever to have addressed the UN Security Council, will explore this question. His talk will be followed by a conversation with the Very Reverend John Witcombe, Dean

of Coventry Cathedral, and Jamie Eyre CEO of Embrace the Middle East.
